Interns are trained to lead small groups of elementary school students through hands-on activities about plant life cycles, pollination, soil science, and more.

- You are able to work outdoors, in variable weather conditions, lifting, digging, using hand tools

- You must be able to pass background check
- (Preferred) You have some background in outdoor education / gardening / farming

Time Commitment:

Interns commit to one weekday per week for 10 weeks of spring field trips (April 8th – June 14th), plus one training day (Friday, April 5th). Daily hours will be 9:00 am – 2:30 pm.

As a Sauvie Island Center Farm Education Intern you will receive:

- Option for college credit (if arranged with your school)
- Experience teaching outdoor education programs with children
- Knowledge of Pacific Northwest ecosystems.
- Knowledge of organic farming practices in the Pacific Northwest
- \$200 stipend upon completion of season

Submit a cover letter and resume with 3 references. Cover letter should address why you are interested in outdoor/agricultural education and your availability during aforementioned program times. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis, but **must be received no later than Monday, April 1st.** Please send all application materials to:
